American Mathematics Competition (Grades 9-12) – Mondays, 3:30-4:30 pm

This club will serve both as an outlet for students who cannot get enough math problems as well as students who want to take part in a competitive math competition. Each week we will work to solve complex math problems while preparing for the competition. Students will learn new problem-solving skill as well as mathematical concepts not taught in their classes. This is a great place to cultivate a deeper love for mathematics.

At the request of many Musical Theatre participants last year, Trivium will offer a club to train scholars in directing and leadership in the context of theatre. Not for the faint of heart, this club will be rigorous in its program, following the wisdom of Thucydides regarding the Spartans: that one person "is much the same as another, and that he is best who is trained in the severest school." Through a combination of focused training as a small cohort and direct application in assisting the Middle School Musical Theatre program, scholars will develop experience and specific tactics for

maximizing their own effectiveness as leaders of their peers in theatre.

Interested scholars must submit an application to Mr. Bradshaw by Monday, August 21; all are welcome to initial meetings in order to get a taste of the unique combination of focus and fun that will characterize this club. We will meet twice weekly (with an option to observe on Tuesdays as well) until November, at which point we will begin adding days to further assist the production of Willy Wonka & the Chocolate Factory. There will be regular “homework” assignments until November, such as readings, written strategy plans, and research; no assignment will require more than 30 minutes from one meeting to the next. After the performance, meetings will return to twice weekly for assessment and discussion of successes and failures, and to look ahead to leadership in subsequent productions.

All are welcome to apply; few will have the humility, commitment, and willingness to change that will be necessary to succeed. If you join, this club will be one of the greatest challenges of your high school career. Do not take it on lightly. There will be an application process for this club. Instructor will contact families regarding payment once their scholar’s application has been accepted.

Audio Engineering club will be an introduction to the basics of live sound and an orientation to Trivium's sound system in particular. Students will have the opportunity to help with the drama productions and musical performances at the end of the first semester. FIRST LEGO League teams research a real-world problem such as food safety, recycling, energy, etc., and are challenged to develop a solution. They also must design, build, program a robot and compete locally or even nationally! It all adds up to tons of fun while they learn to apply science, technology, engineering, and math concepts (STEM), plus a big dose of imagination, to solve a problem. Along their discovery journey, they develop critical thinking and team-building skills, basic STEM applications, and even presentation skills, as they must present their solutions with a dash of creativity to judges. This year's theme... HYDRODYNAMICS!

Middle school scholars, now is your time to SHINE!!! If you have a ton of experience or if you just want to learn how to perform, we want you! We will be performing "Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory, Jr.", during Theater Week in November. Rehearsals will start September 5, and be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Rehearsals will increase 2 weeks prior to performance and may include a Saturday "picnic rehearsal". We need to cast both actors and stage crew. Middle school actors are able to play a sport this fall, as long as it doesn't interfere with rehearsals. High School Musical Theater Club will meet/perform during the Spring semester.

Auditions will be held after-school on August 28 and 29 with tentative call backs on August 31. You must sign-up for an audition time beginning Wednesday, August 23 in the Prep Atrium Entrance. **Auditions are not required for stage crew.** Stage Crew will only be required to attend rehearsal once a week for the first month. You may register for the club before auditions.

Performances will tentatively be the week/weekend of Nov 16-18. Performance dates will be finalized by audition times.

Mock Trial (Grades 9-12) – Mondays 7:10-7:50 am, Tuesdays, 3:15-5:00 pm, Thursdays 6-8 pm (beginning Nov 2)

COST: \$160/year-long commitment **INSTRUCTOR:** Mrs. Brinker ***Max Enrollment of 18 students**

Mock trial is an amazing program, teaching and enhancing analytical thinking and public speaking skills, as well as poise and self-confidence. Each year, the Arizona Foundation for Legal Services and Education puts out a new mock trial case that is either criminal or civil in nature. Each team is comprised of 6-8 students who present either the prosecution/plaintiff or defense side of the case through playing the roles of attorneys and witnesses in a simulated trial. Each team prepares both sides of the case, including opening statements, direct examinations, cross-examinations, and closing arguments.

During a given round of competition, a team will present one side of the case against a team from a different school that would be presenting the other side. Arizona holds a regional competition in early March from which teams have the opportunity to advance to the state competition in late March or early April. The winner of the state competition advances to the national competition in May. Beginning in January, students will be required to attend extended and/or additional practice times in preparation for regional, state, and national competitions.
