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### American Mathematics Competition (Grades 9-12) – Mondays, 3:30-4:30 pm

**DOES NOT RE-OPEN FOR SPRING ENROLLMENT**

**COST:** \$85/year-long commitment      **INSTRUCTOR:** Mrs. (Hofer) McKnight      **\*Max Enrollment of 15 students**

This club will serve both as an outlet for students who cannot get enough math problems as well as students who want to take part in a competitive math competition. Each week we will work to solve complex math problems while preparing for the competition. Students will learn new problem-solving skill as well as mathematical concepts not taught in their classes. This is a great place to cultivate a deeper love for mathematics.

FIRST LEGO League teams research a real-world problem such as food safety, recycling, energy, etc., and are challenged to develop a solution. They also must design, build, program a robot and compete locally or even nationally! It all adds up to tons of fun while they learn to apply science, technology, engineering, and math concepts (STEM), plus a big dose of imagination, to solve a problem. Along their discovery journey, they develop critical thinking and team-building skills, basic STEM applications, and even presentation skills, as they must present their solutions with a dash of creativity to judges. This year's theme... HYDRODYNAMICS!

Mock trial is an amazing program, teaching and enhancing analytical thinking and public speaking skills, as well as poise and self-confidence. Each year, the Arizona Foundation for Legal Services and Education puts out a new mock trial case that is either criminal or civil in nature. Each team is comprised of 6-8 students who present either the prosecution/plaintiff or defense side of the case through playing the roles of attorneys and witnesses in a simulated trial. Each team prepares both sides of the case, including opening statements, direct examinations, cross-examinations, and closing arguments. During a given round of competition, a team will present one side of the case against a team from a different school that would be presenting the other side. Arizona holds a regional competition in early March from which teams have the opportunity to advance to the state competition in late March or early April. The winner of the state competition advances to the national competition in May. Beginning in January, students will be required to attend extended and/or additional practice times in preparation for regional, state, and national competitions.

**CREW:** Theatre Crew allows scholars the opportunity to perform real, meaningful work with tangible and visible results. Though it may seem thankless, and though it is not as glamorous and glittery as being an actor on stage, being the moving force behind a successful and well-executed play gratifies a crew member with something greater than mere thanks or applause. It offers a sense of pride and accomplishment. It instills one with the knowledge of one's own worth and value. It teaches the crew member not to depend upon recognition, but to know that the result of one's good work is sufficient reward.

If you are prepared to do such work for three months, if you wish to become self-reliant and effective in what you do, or if you just like playing with power tools, sewing equipment, and makeup brushes, talk to Mr. Schutten, Mrs. Ogle, or Mr. Bradshaw about whether crew is right for you.
